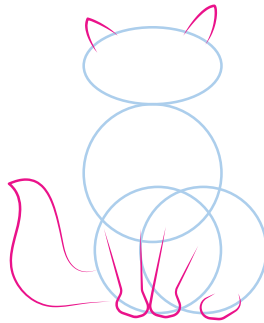


Marshmallow Pie

Learn to draw ME! Just follow the steps below to create a fabulous picture of your favourite superstar cat!



1) Draw a large circle in the middle of your page. Then draw an oblong on top and two smaller circles underneath.



2) Draw a curvy line for the tail, two small triangles for ears and two front legs and a back foot shape.



3) Join the circle shapes to form Pie's body, then draw a small square with two triangles from the sides to make the bow tie. You can rub out the pencil lines inside the main body shape.



4) Draw a two curved lines for the top of the eyes, and two semi circles underneath. The draw an upside-down heart for the nose and two semi circle lines coming out from the bottom.



5) Now draw the two pupils in the eyes, a small line on the end of the mouth and draw the toes onto the feet.



6) Now you can draw lots of zig-zag lines over Pie's body to make him look fluffy.



7) Finally, draw two small lines to show Pie's chin and cheek, then add 6 whiskers.



8) To add more detail to your drawing, you can add lots of dots to the bow tie, and shading to show more fur.

become an expert thief.

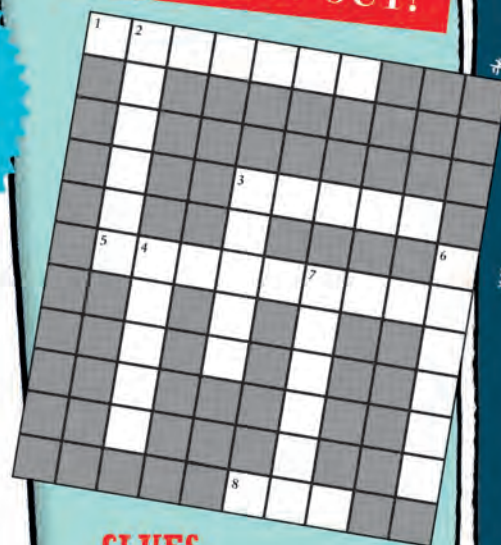

STARFELL

Holloway's Rain Biscuits

Ingredients

- ★ 1 cup caster sugar
- ★ 1 egg
- ★ 180g butter, softened
- ★ 2 cups plain flour, sifted
- ★ 1 tsp vanilla essence
- ★ 1/2 tsp baking powder

Instructions

- ★ Preheat oven to 180°C
- ★ In a large bowl combine the butter, sugar and vanilla essence until it is creamed. Add the egg and stir well
- ★ In a separate bowl sift the flour and baking powder, then add this to the butter mix until it forms a dough. Keep mixing even though it might seem there isn't enough butter mix
- ★ Once it's all mixed and dough-like, roll out the mixture into small balls (around two teaspoons worth). If adding decorations like sprinkles, flatten them slightly, then place on a lined baking tray
- ★ Bake for around 12-15 minutes, or until lightly golden brown. Bake for just 10 minutes if you prefer them light and soft

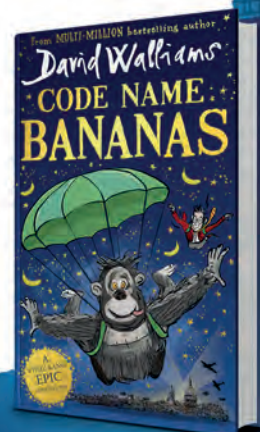
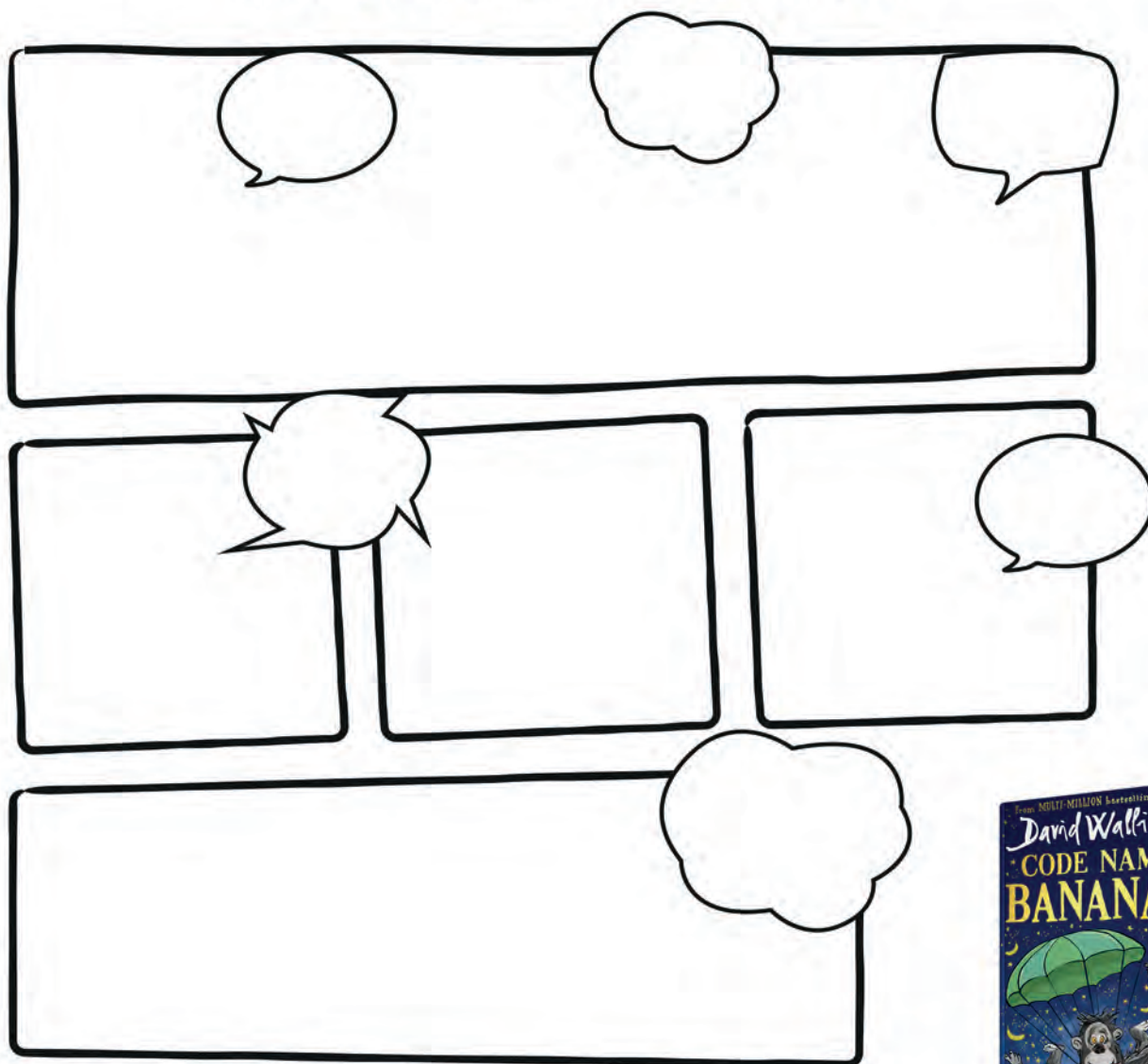
