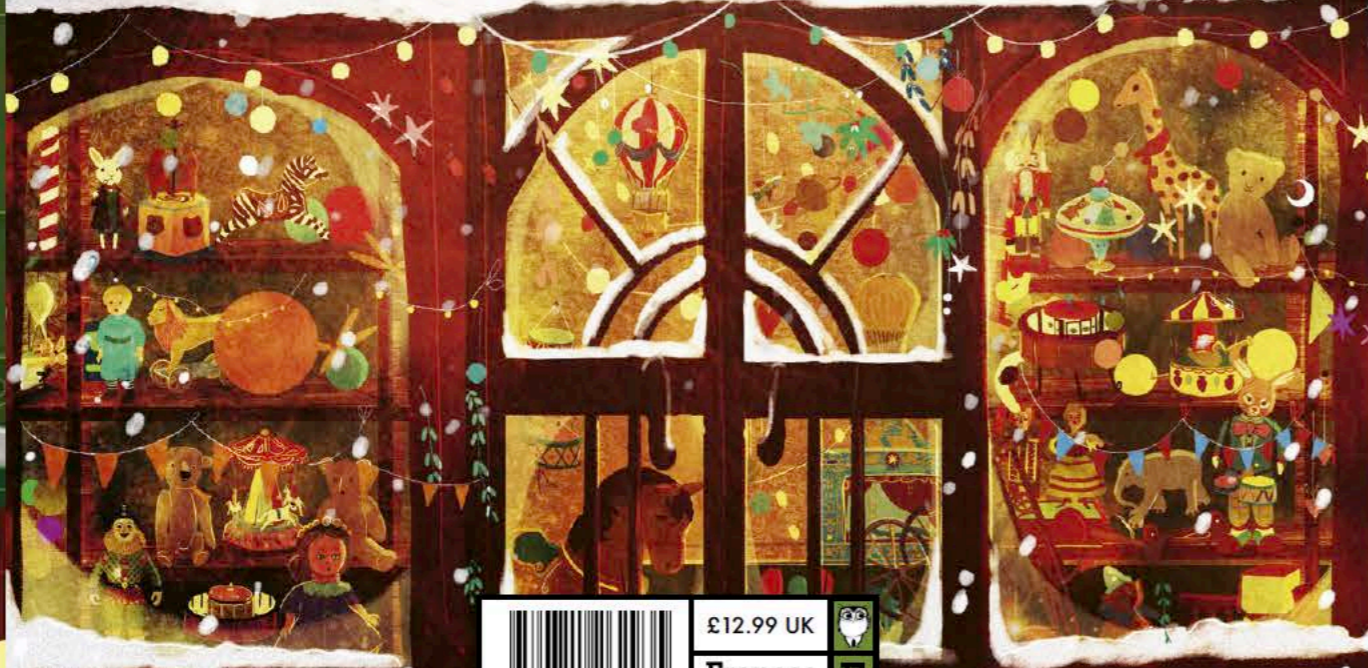

This uplifting Christmas tale tells the story of young Nicky Claus who wanted to make every child in the city happy, even if it was for just for one day.

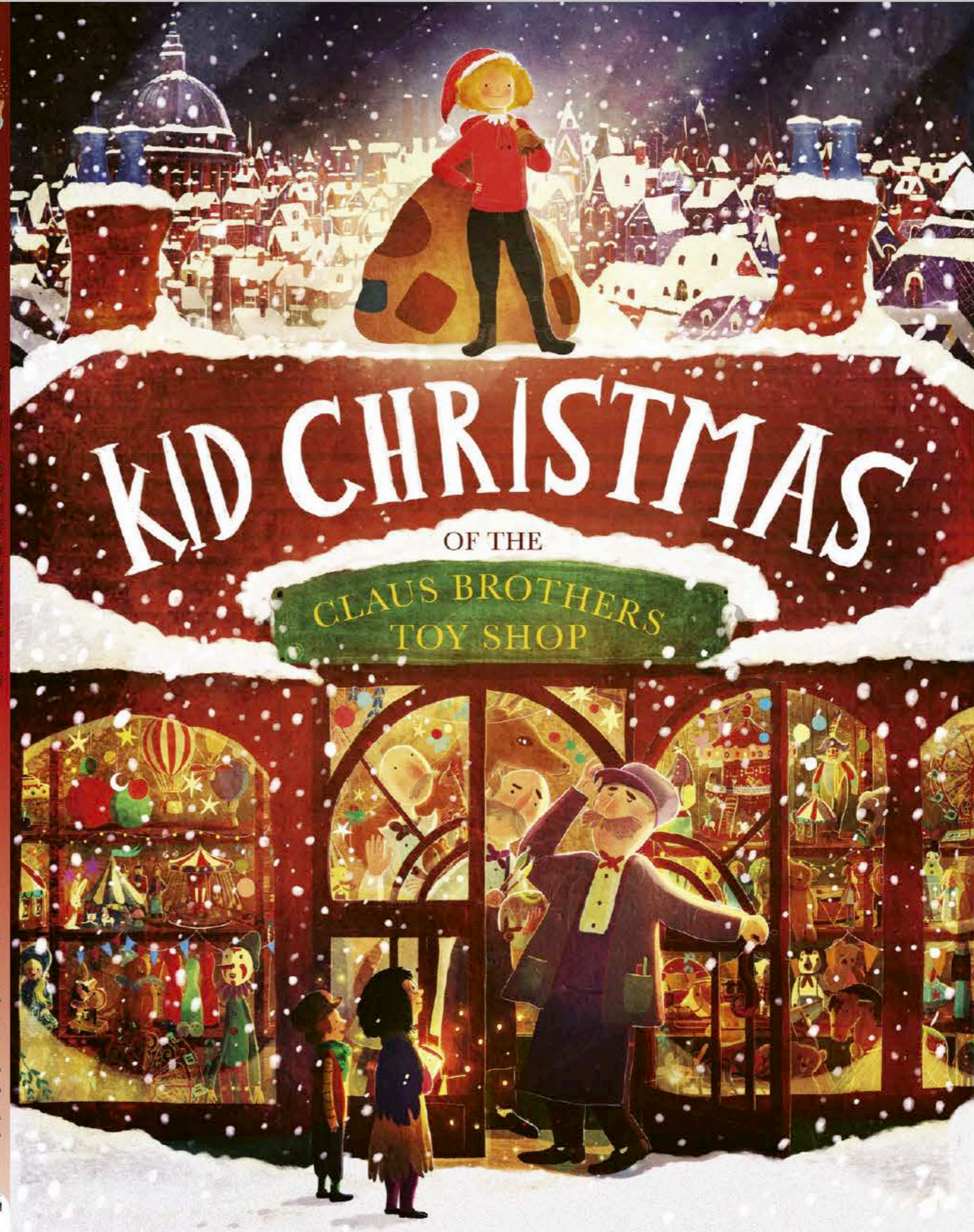

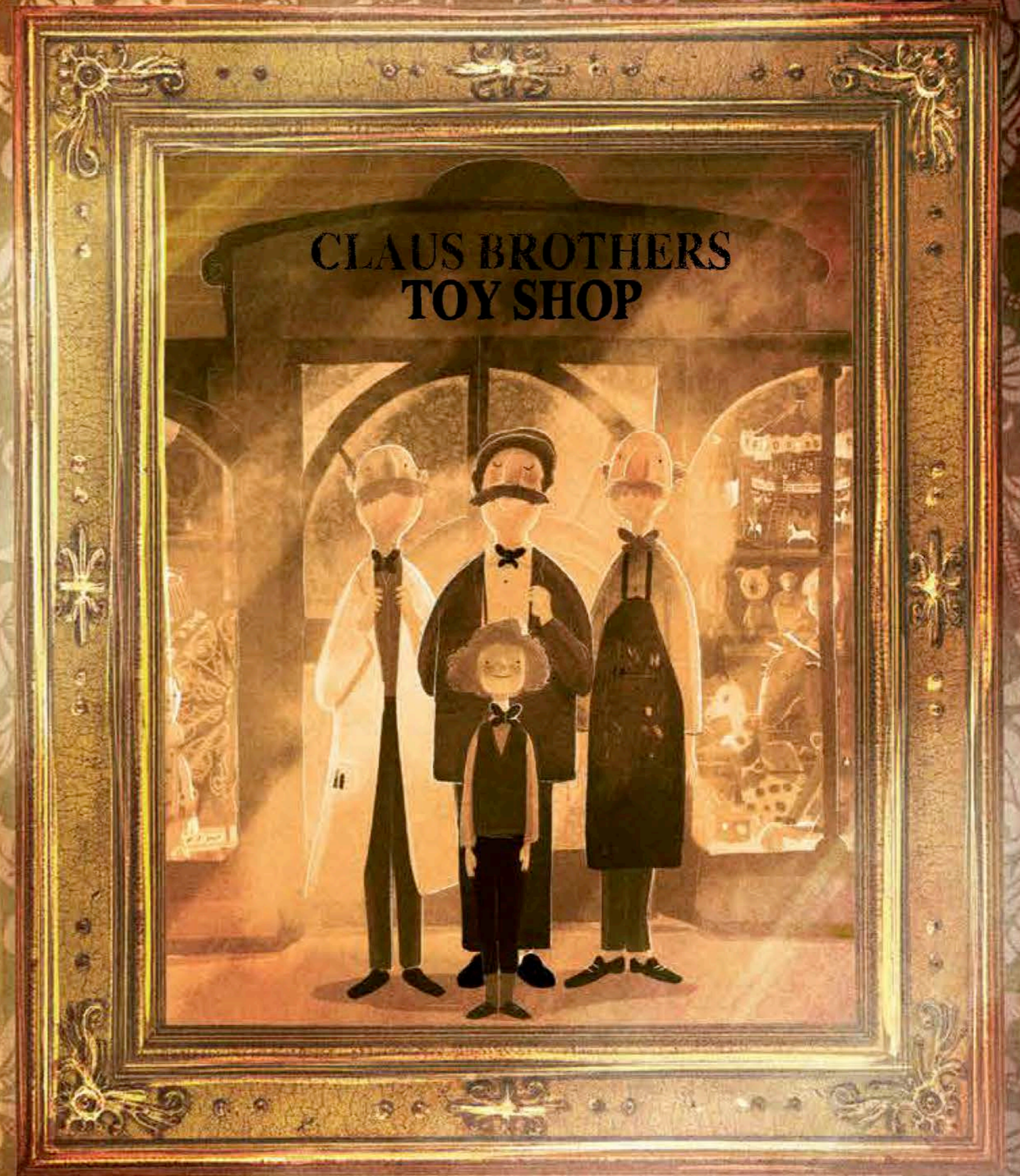

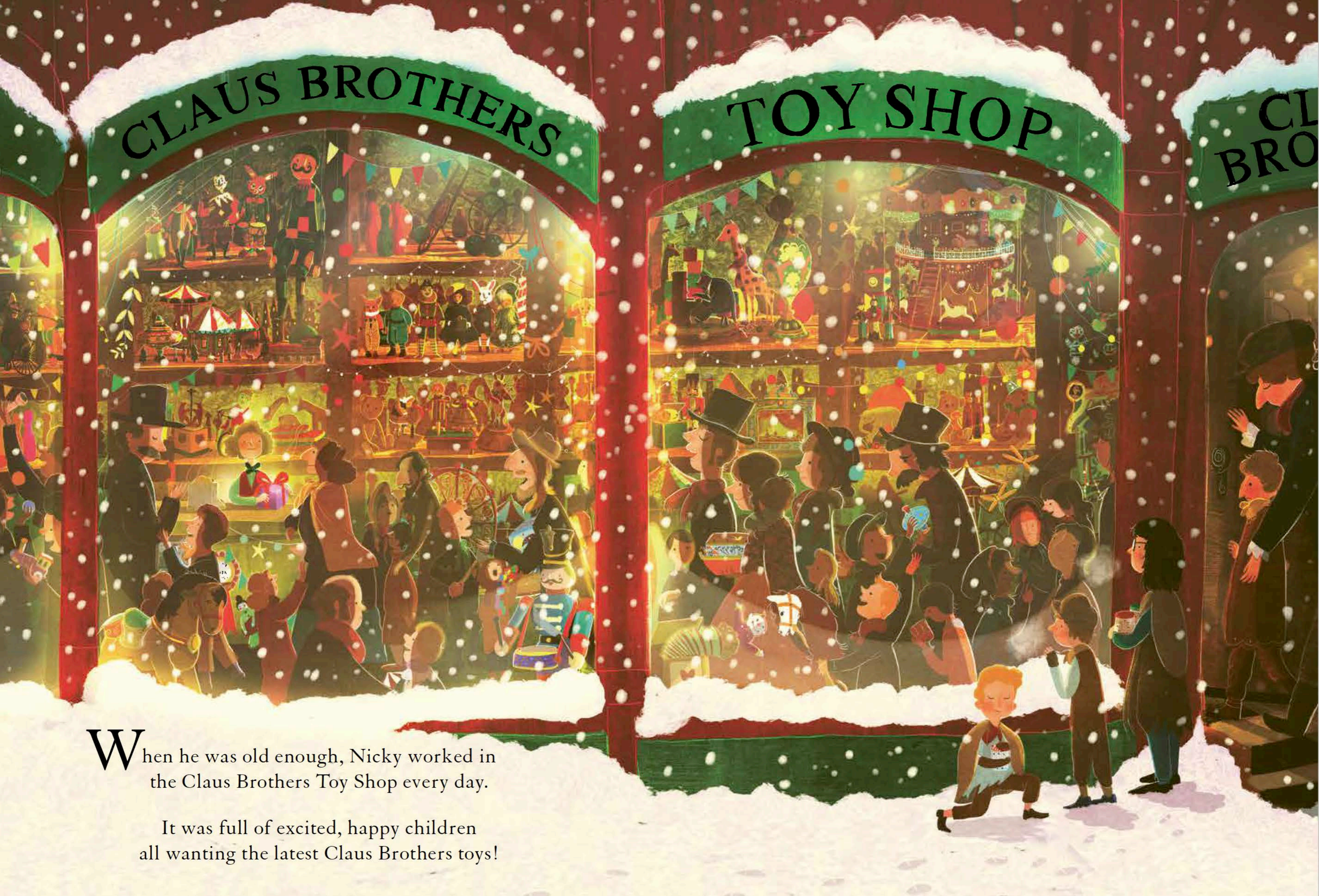
When Nicky was born

But, of course, not every child *could* have a toy.

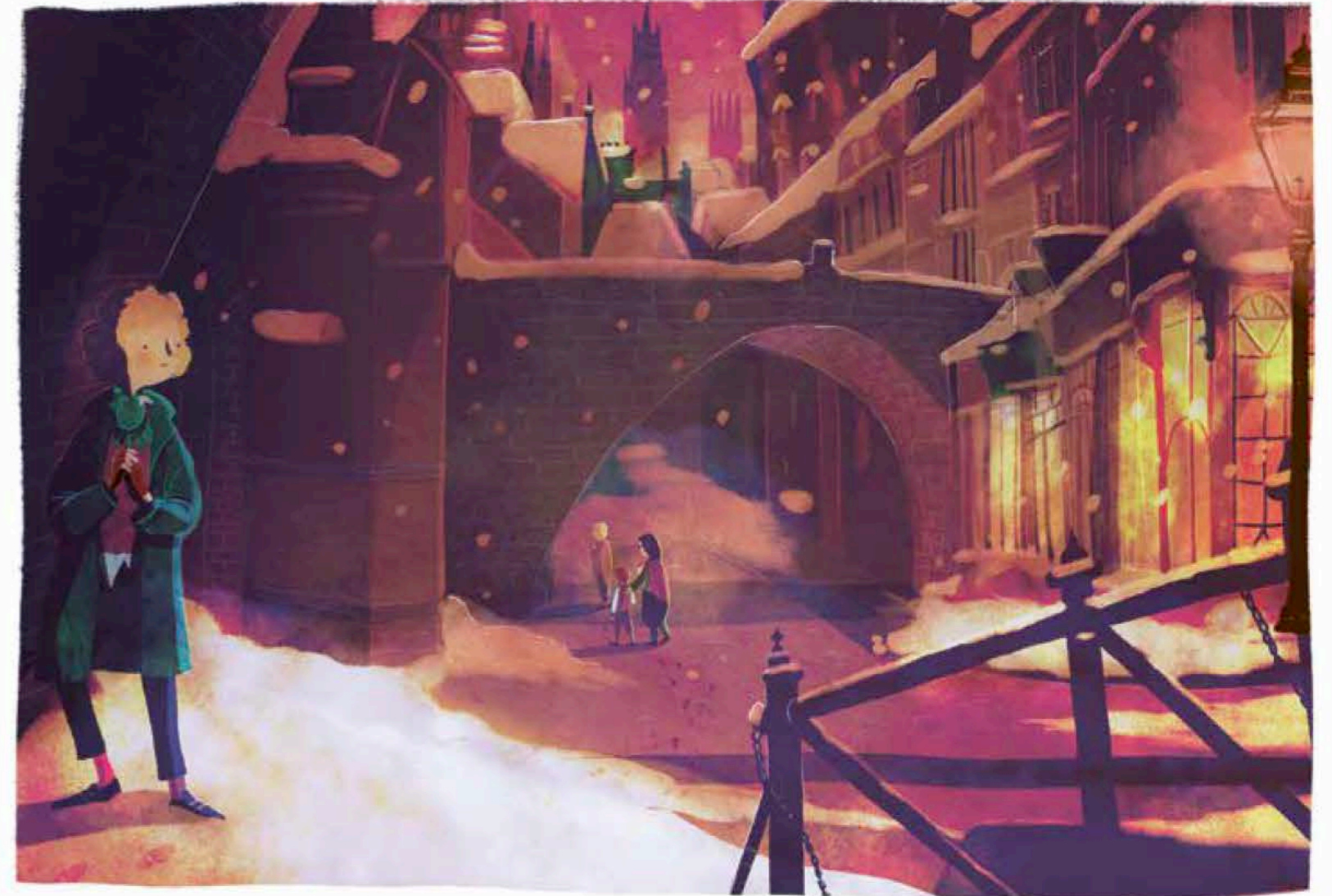


Every so often, Nicky noticed another group of children outside the shop window.

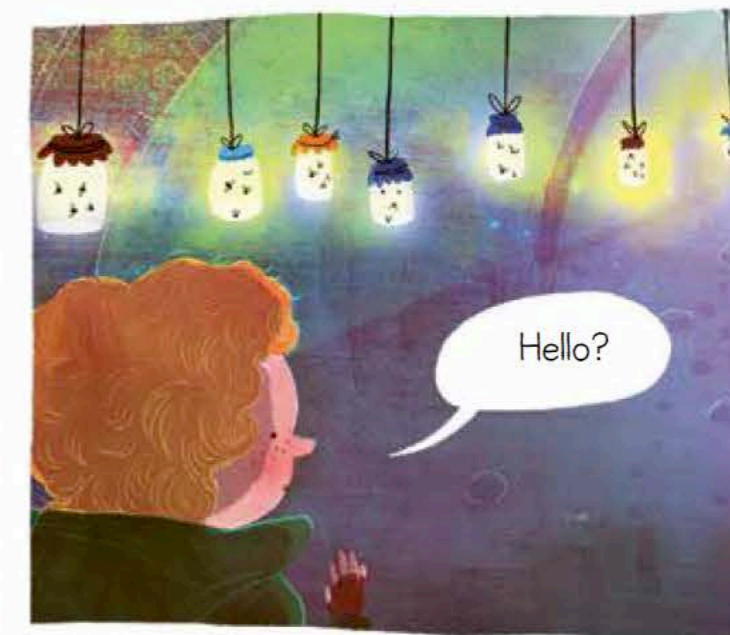


Nicky would invite them inside, but they would always just run away.
