Q Why will readers enjoy the book?

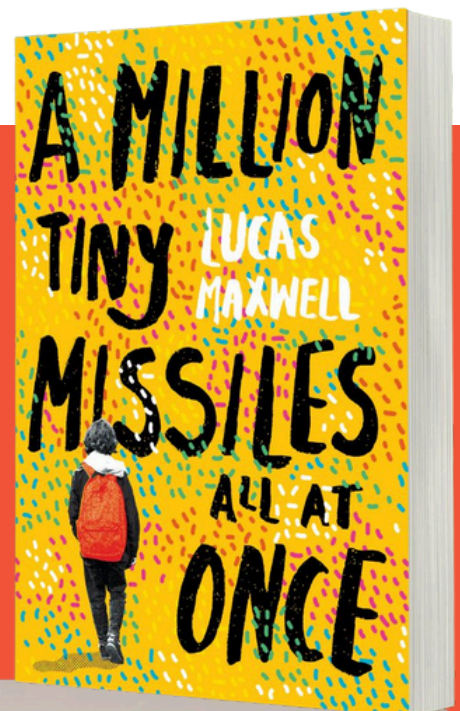
