## Recycled bird feeder

ask an  
adult to

### What you need

- empty plastic bottle
- felt-tip pen
- scissors
- wooden stick
- pin
- eco-friendly decorations
- bird seed
- wire or strong string



Use the felt-tip pen to draw a big circle on the side of the plastic bottle. Carefully cut it out, making a window large enough for birds to reach inside.



Just under the window, cut two small holes on either side of the bottle. Push the stick through the two holes so it pokes out both sides, making a perch for birds.



Pierce a few small holes at the bottom of your feeder with a pin. This will allow rainwater to drain away.



Style your bird feeder with eco-friendly decorations, like leaves, flowers, tissue paper or non-toxic paints.



Fill your feeder with bird seed until it covers the stick. Then hang it with wire or strong string outside for the birds to enjoy!

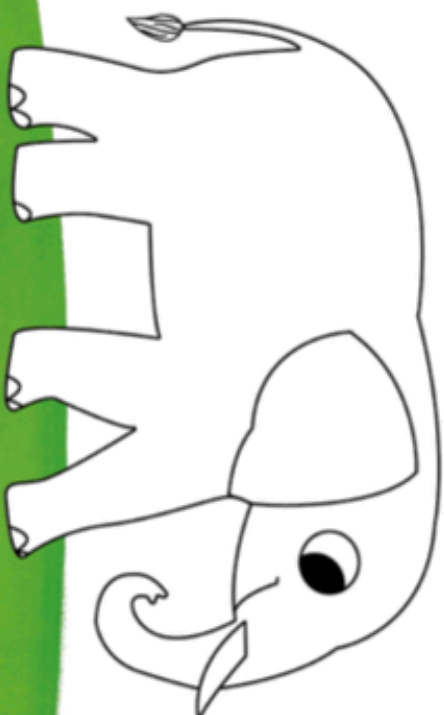
